The **Forest Stewards Guild** invites interested individuals to apply for a summer/fall forestry technician position on a small timber marking crew in the enchanting Zuni Mountains of western New Mexico! The position will be based out of the **Mt. Taylor Ranger District in Grants, NM**. Scope of work will be grounded in active projects related to forest restoration and fire resilience.

July 26 - October 1 | 40 hours/week | \$15.50 per hour.

Applicants must be able to work up to 10 hours and hike 5+ miles per day while carrying 15 lbs.

Successful applicants will learn the basics of forestry, including how and why land managers treat the forest in the way they do.

Learn how to:

- Select the best trees for restoration
- Follow prescriptions for treatment of cutting units
- Take basic forestry measurements, such as tree diameter, height, class, and basal area
- Mark trees for harvest or retention following ecological guidelines

This position is under the employ of the Forest Stewards Guild and supported and supervised by timber staff on the Mt. Taylor Ranger district. All work helps to advance the Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Program, a national funding source which finances work in the Zuni Mountains, and the Puerco Project.
